ADVISOR RESEARCH GRANT

The Board of Directors of CAAHP wishes to support research that contributes to the field of Pre-Health Professional Advising. To this end, the CAAHP Board set aside funding for two \$500.00 research grants to be awarded in 2011.

As there is funding for only two grants, we cannot guarantee an award to all who apply. 2011 CAAHP Research Grants will be awarded by the 2011 CAAHP Research Grant Selection Committee. Applicants may submit only one application for the 2011 CAAHP Research Grant. Applicants are required to be members of CAAHP, complete the attached research grant application completely, and submit all materials by the deadline for consideration. Selection will be based on the following criteria, (not presented in any rank order): (A) Number of grant proposals from one school (e.g., one research grant per school as a priority); (B) Applicant(s) is a health professions advisor; (C) Degree to which responses to questions comply with instructions; professional form of responses (e.g., responses should be free of numerous mechanical errors and instances of inappropriate diction); (D) The 2011 CAAHP Research Grant Selection Committee's appraisal of the following areas:

- The general purpose and specific objectives of the project
- The probable benefits to health professions advising
- What results or products expected to be generated from the project
- Methodologies, equipment, or resources that used to bring endeavor to fruition

It is recommended that recipients of the CAAHP Research Grant submit their work for publication in the *Advisor*. However, recipients of the CAAHP Research Grant are not required to do so and there is no guarantee or other arrangement that CAAHP Research Grant recipients' work will be accepted for publication in the *Advisor*.

All expenses awarded will be reimbursed after expenditures or purchases have taken place. The CAAHP Research Grant may not be used as additional salary for the award recipient. Some examples of how the CAAHP Research Grant may be used are hiring a student assistant to assist with research, purchasing an account with Survey Monkey or Statistical Software, Purchasing transcribing assistance, and so forth .

The CAAHP Board of Directors is pleased to be able to offer this research grant to advisors and hopes to continue this support. The CAAHP reserved the right to make changes to the CAAHP Research Grant Application and Selection Procedures. All expenses to a maximum of \$500.00 will be reimbursed after purchase or expenditure and will require original receipts. The CAAHP research grant may not be used as additional salary for the recipient.
